CREDIT COURSES

INTRODUCTION TO TECHNOLOGY 2140

Grades: 9,10,11,12

Time/Credit 1 semester/.50 credit Prereq: none

To prepare our students for the technology skills needed for high school and college, this graduation required course fosters the mastery of word-processing, spreadsheet, database, and presentation programs. This course incorporates the most current word-processing and presentation software techniques as well as integrating various electronic resources. This course is a hands-on, project-based class with students working individually, as well as cooperatively.

ART FUNDAMENTALS 4100

Grades 9,10,11,12

Time/Credit: 1 semester/.50 credit Prereq: none

This course will introduce the beginning artist to the basic elements needed to design any type of visual communication. The student will be introduced to the concepts of line, shape, form, space, texture, value, and color.

HEALTH 7205

GRADE LEVEL: 9,10,11,12

Time/Credit: 1 semester/.50 credit Prereq: none

This course is designed to inform students of health issues and to learn how to make informed healthy choices. The students will gain a thorough knowledge of nutrition, identify health risks such as tobacco, alcohol and drug use, and learn skills to maintain a healthy lifestyle. These students will become certified in CPR and AED through the American Red Cross. This is a non-activity class. There is a Health book required.
